InspirASIAN National President's Message

May is Asian Pacific American Heritage Month. It's not only a time for celebration, but also one for reflection. I think of how fortunate I am to be given the opportunities to live out both my personal and professional dreams. It hasn't always been easy for members of our community, and it still isn't for many. I'd like to share a story of a young man that I recently met, who reminds me of what InspirASIAN stands for when it comes to inspiring our members to do their part in igniting possibilities for our communities.

More than three years ago, AT&T Pioneers and InspirASIAN hosted a job shadow event, with the Union of Pan Asian Communities — Alliance for Community Empowerment (UPAC ACE). AT&T Pioneers, through a grant, helped launch a program that teaches marketable skills to underserved youth groups, focusing on entrepreneurship and hands-on experience in product marketing, business development and management. Our ERG has a long history of volunteer and giving with UPAC, and over the holiday season, our members engaged with a group of young Karen refugees from Southeast Asia. As we learned of their dreams and ambitions of working for companies like AT&T, our members shared invaluable professional insights and advice. One of students at this event was El Klu, born in the Mae La Refugee Camp in Thailand, who came to San Diego when he was five through the United Nations Refugee Program.

This vibrant, young student was to become one of the speakers at our *Good Fortune Mixer* signature event in 2017, where over 125 AT&T employees were inspired by stories of resilience from Karen refugees now living the American Dream. When InspirASIAN delivered stockings filled with winter garments as part of the *Gift of Warmth* program this past holiday season, we met El Klu again.

Then, at a recent Junior Achievement mentoring event at a local high school, a familiar face approached me and told me that he remembered me for all things that AT&T had done for him over the past couple years. It was El Klu, who was just accepted in a precollege program for promising underprivileged students. He takes robotics classes in school while attending computer coding classes at UCSD. El Klu is also earning a food handler's certificate as part of UPAC's program, and aspires to study business and law to become a community advocate. He wants to help more children, much like the role models and mentors that he is grateful to have met over the years.

I was moved, and honored that the little that we have done has made a difference. As we celebrate Asian Pacific American Heritage Month, I encourage you to do your part in

giving back to the community. There are so many talented and deserving young adults like El Klu, who you can inspire and support.
